GETTING THINGS DONE IN THE GLEN

As the new year begins, it's a good time to review some basics on how to get things done here in the Glen.

If you spot a maintenance problem for which the Glen is responsible or see a tree on Glen property that is downed or unsafe, please contact our on-site staff. A simple e-mail to Nelson & Maria at fairlingtonglen3m@verizon.net is the best course of action. And please copy the Glen's new property manager, Karen Conroy, on your requests. Her address is k.conroy@cardinalmanagementgroup.com.



Karen has overall responsibility for determining, subject to Board policy, how and when your problem will be solved. Our on-site crew, of course, will usually be familiar enough with your type of problem to be able to get to work right away without first checking with Karen.

Board members are charged with establishing the *general policies and direction of the Glen*, not with managing day-to-day operations. Contact Board members or attend a monthly Board meeting if you believe that staff has not adequately addressed your problem or if you want to propose changes in the general direction or policies of the Glen. The first 30 minutes of each Board meeting is dedicated to our Residents' Forum. This year's Board meeting schedule is posted on page 2 of this newsletter.

If you want to have a healthy tree planted, removed, or trimmed, or to find out about tending to your own flower beds, please contact our new Landscape Committee Chair Corey Love. Corey's e-mail is GlenLandscaping@gmail.com.

Landscape requests may be made twice a year in writing prior to the spring and fall landscape walk-throughs. In fact, there's information to follow in this issue of the Glen Echo about the spring landscape walk-through. The necessary landscape request forms are included in this newsletter, but they are also found on our website. We consider each request with an eye to maintaining the health and beauty of our landscaping and community. However, not all requests can be met. And it's stressed that a request doesn't always mean the work will be approved and completed.

Finally, in each issue of our newsletter, and also found on our website, is the Fairlington Glen Contact List. This list contains important information about the Board members, the Court Representatives, and other coordinators and committee chairs. These are knowledgeable folks who can advise you about things like variances, pool operations, this newsletter, the tennis courts, the basketball court, and Glen finances. Remember, it's always better to ask when in doubt. And, it's a great idea to print the list and keep it in a handy place so that when things need to be done you'll know where to turn.



CHRISTMAS TREE PICK UP

Capitol Services, our trash contractor, will offer three days early this month for recycling of live Christmas trees.

The dates are January 3, January 8, and January 10.

Place your tree in the area where recycling items are placed each week. Trees are only to be left out either the night before or the morning of pick up.

SPRING LANDSCAPE WALK-THROUGH

The Glen's Landscape Committee has set Saturday, March 23 at 9:00am as the date/time for the annual spring landscape walkthrough. Join us as we walk through the community reviewing the plantings in our common areas.

GLEN'S RED REFLECTOR PROGRAM CONTINUES IN 2013

The mulched beds surrounding our homes area actually common area property and are maintained by the Glen's landscape contractor, Environmental Enhancements (EE). However, residents who prefer to maintain their flower beds themselves must apply

annually for the Glen's red reflector. By placing the red reflector in your flower bed, this will notify the contractor to skip that area.

FAIRLINGTON GLEN REQUEST FOR LANDSCAPING WAIVER

Requests should be received by March 16, 2013

The mulched beds surrounding our homes are common property and are maintained by the landscaping contractor. However, some residents prefer to maintain their common front or side beds themselves. In that case the resident should submit this form annually and place a red reflector in the common area bed.

	This form must be com	pleted each year	– it does not carry	over from y	year to year!
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The responsible party:

Will install a red reflector in the bed.

Will weed, feed, water, prune, and deadhead the flower bed regularly.

Will not install any invasive plants including but not limited to English Ivy.

Will comply with Glen policies in using any pesticides.

Will mulch with materials similar to those used by the Glen contractor.

Understands that the Glen Board of Directors reserves the right to assume responsibility for improperly maintained beds.

IN CASE YOU WERE WONDERING...

The community association lifestyle attracts all kinds of residents, varying in age, income, career and family status. Here's a look at who your neighbors are in the Glen.

Empty nesters—People without children or whose children have grown up and moved out are attracted by the low maintenance, amenities, and security of community association living.

Working couples—Double-income couples can afford traditional homes, but many prefer community association living because they don't have to spend as much time on maintenance.

Singles—Community associations offer affordable homeownership for those with a single income.

Retirees—Low maintenance, security, lifestyle and amenities are all aspects of community association living that appeal to senior Americans.

First-time buyers—Many first-time buyers find it easier to enter the real estate market with the relatively lower cost of condominium units.

Investors—Community associations appeal to investors because they often compensate for shortages in the local rental markets.

CRIME PREVENTION REMINDERS

All Glen residents should be vigilant regarding suspicious activities in our community. The Arlington County Police Department (ACPD) needs to be aware of such activities in order to help us maintain security throughout the Glen.

If you notice suspicious activities, please call the ACPD at 703-558-2222 for non-emergency situations or 911 if it appears to be an emergency. Both numbers are answered 24 hours a day.

To help deter criminal activity in our neighborhood, all residents are encouraged to do the following:

- Keep front and back porch lights on when it's dark.
- Be aware of your environment when you're out walking and when you're home. Report suspicious incidents to the ACPD.
- Report non-functioning lights in your court to our on-site staff.
- Don't store valuable belongings in your car where they can be seen. If possible, use a steering wheel theft prevention device.
- Stop newspaper and mail delivery when you're out of town. Or have a neighbor pick up papers and packages while you're away. Leave a contact phone number with a neighbor.
