#### Survey Says Residents Are Happy

We're confident that most residents in Fairlington Glen are happy living in our community. But how do more than 62 million Americans who live in homeowners associations and condominium communities feel about their associations? What about their association assessments? The Foundation for Community Association Research, an affiliate of the Community Associations Institute (CAI), sponsored a recent national public opinion survey to answer these and other questions. Here are some of the key findings:

- 70 percent of residents in common-interest communities say they are satisfied with their community association experience. Eight percent express dissatisfaction and 22 percent are neutral.
- 88 percent of residents believe their association board members strive to serve the best interests of the community, while 12 percent disagree or aren't sure.
- 73 percent say their professional managers provide value to their communities, while 21 percent say their managers aren't an asset to the association and 6 percent say they aren't sure.
- 76 percent believe their own community association rules "protect and enhance" property values. Only 3 percent say the rules harm property values, while the rest see no difference.
- 81 percent of residents say they get a "good" or "great" return for their association assessments, while 18 percent say the return is "not so good" or "bad." The rest were unsure.

In the Glen, we like to think we are even better than the national averages. We encourage you to get involved and help make our community an even better place to live. Volunteers are needed to run for the Board, sit on committees, and become court representatives. Ask a Board member for more info, and read more about running for the Board in this issue of the Glen Echo.


## Do's And Don'ts Of Political Signs

Between now and Election Day on Tuesday, November 6 we will see an influx of political signs dotting the landscapes everywhere throughout Northern Virginia. Candidates of all parties running for any number of offices will use campaign signs to spread their messages and catch your eyes. But please note, in Fairlington Glen we have specific rules for the display of political signs, and we ask you to kindly pay strict attention to those rules.

In the Glen, political signs are not permitted in the common areas; however, a single political sign per unit may be displayed in a window for 31 days before an election and must be removed within five days after an election.

Arlington County prohibits political signs in the county property between the street and the sidewalk.

# It's Back To School Season, Safety Is Emphasized



As boys and girls throughout Fairlington sharpen their pencils and get ready to head back to class, it's very important to ensure that they have a safe school year. Here are some valuable tips on how your family can be proactive and avoid potentially harmful situations:

- Make sure your school has your child's updated emergency contact information. Write
  down any specific instructions that should be followed in case of an emergency, and
  have the school keep them in your child's file.
- Talk to your child's teachers before classes start and alert them to any medical issues your child may have. Also, explain to the teacher what he or she should do if the medical issues arise—such as an allergic reaction, an asthma attack, or a seizure. Be sure to provide school personnel with any necessary emergency medication.
- Help your children memorize important phone numbers so that they know how to get in touch with you and other trusted adults. Make sure those numbers are programmed into their cell phones, or provide them with a list of phone numbers that they can keep in their backpacks or wallets at all times.
- Let your children know who they can go home with after school if their regular ride can't pick them up, and make sure they know not to accept rides from strangers.
- If your children will be walking to school, walk the route with them before classes start to make sure they understand traffic laws and can walk it on their own. Plus, find a friend or sibling they can walk with, and make sure they always use the buddy system.
- Report reckless drivers to the Arlington County Police Department to help make sure the neighborhood remains safe, particularly during times when kids are going to and returning from school.

The school bell will soon be ringing in the start of the 2012-13 school year. Drivers should pay extra caution as kids and buses become part of the daily commute.

#### Do You Have What It Takes?

If you're considering running for the Board, simply take a few moments to ask yourself these three important questions:

- 1. **Do I have the time?** As a Board member, you will need to devote several hours of your time each month to association business. In addition to regular monthly Board meetings held on the second Tuesday of each month, you will need to be active in e-mail discussions and occasional special meetings. During special projects, you may need to spend a little extra time on association business. Some Board members may also spend a little more time than others if they work with a committee or contribute to this newsletter.
- **2. Can I make tough decisions when it's required?** The primary role of the Board is to conduct the business of the association. This doesn't just mean voting on a budget, but also includes developing and enforcing policies. Board members are required to step outside their immediate circle of family and neighbors to make decisions based on the greater good of Fairlington Glen.
- **3. Can I do all of this and have fun too?** It isn't all about policies and tough decisions. Our community is only as good as we make it, and establishing and maintaining a sense of community is part of a Board member's responsibility. Planning and attending functions and being a presence in the community are as important as any policy decisions you may make.

Being a Board member can be one of the most rewarding ways you'll find to volunteer your time. And for those new residents in Fairlington Glen, you are reminded that many of your long-time neighbors have already served the community in previous years. Check the plaque near the bulletin board at the Glen pool. It lists the names of our Board presidents through the years. But it doesn't include the numerous other volunteers who served on the Board, worked on committees, or became court representatives. On the following page, please find a special contribution from two former Board members who share their thoughts on the matter.

Fairlington Glen has a rich history of dedicated volunteers. Without them, our community's day-today work may come to a halt. Now that you've asked yourself the important questions, we ask you to step forward and run for the Board. ### Fairlington Glen Is Run By Those Who Show Up!

The Glen has 352 separate households, of which about 75% are occupied by their owners. While any owner can run for our board of directors, the most likely group is the 260 or so resident owners who live here. They are needed to manage everything from our finances to our parking lots, our flowers to our pool, and everything in between. (Our management company, Cardinal Management, actually takes care of most of the day to day things, but the Board is responsible for policy decisions and their implementation. And our employees, Nelson and Maria, are the ones who do most of the work!)

So, what are the issues that you care the most about?

The safety and reliability of the pool, the playground and the rest of our amenities?

Our financial stability and its impact on your monthly fees and the future of your investment in your home?

The look of our landscaping? Your bushes? Your neighbor's bushes?

Drainage? Sewer laterals (some people really know what those are)?
