Mosquito Season is Here; Fight the Bite!

Mosquitoes are a seasonal pest problem all over the United States, including here in Virginia. Generally, mosquito season begins in early spring, peaks in the summer when warmer weather brings more pests, and ends with the first freeze.

Weather often affects the mosquito population. For example, a long, hot summer affords mosquitoes more opportunities to breed and bite. Wet weather creates more standing water, which mosquitoes favor for breeding grounds. Mosquitoes feed by biting people or animals, and their prime dining hours are generally at dawn and dusk.

With mosquito season (May 1 - October 31 in Northern Virginia) here, let's review some relatively easy ways to enjoy our patios and other outdoor spaces while minimizing mosquitoes. If we each participate, then we can reduce their numbers.

The most important step is to eliminate potential mosquito breeding areas. They breed in water that is still for just a few days. You can help by:

- Unclogging gutter extensions in the front plant beds of your units and within your patios.
- Covering, turning over, or moving indoors any containers or toys that may collect water.
- Straightening sagging tarps or other covers to eliminate standing water.
- Filling in areas under outdoor faucets or air conditioning drains.
- Removing English Ivy (its dense nature allows it to hold in pooled water).
- Changing water regularly in bird baths in your patio.
- Using mosquito dunks in bird baths, fountains, or downspout extender openings (toxic to mosquito larvae, but not to birds).

Latest News From the Board

The Fairlington Glen Board of Directors held their monthly meeting on Tuesday, May 13, 2025. Here are some of the highlights.

APPROVED

Moved to direct Cardinal Management: (1) to make the accounting adjustment required by our June 2024 resolution on the net worth side of our balance sheet; but (2) on the asset side of our balance sheet, to avoid multiple bank transfers by postponing any transfer of funds between our operating and contingency bank accounts until we know which overall (net) direction funds will be moving after we approve a similar resolution reflecting the results of the audit of 2024. The Treasurer explained that: (1) we make this type of adjustment every year and that it usually goes smoothly; but (2) the auditor reported that Cardinal Management failed to implement this resolution in 2024.

Moved to resolve that: (1) Courts 1-4, originally scheduled for painting in 2026, will be painted in 2025 along with Courts 13-16; (2) no courts will be batch contracted for paint in 2026; and, accordingly (3) no funds for painting-related carpentry will be budgeted for 2026.

Moved to resolve that the proactive roof maintenance work scheduled for 2026 in Courts 5-8 will be postponed until 2027.

Moved to ratify the earlier unanimous email vote to deny a landscape variance for sodding of the right side lot median in Court 3.

Moved to ratify the earlier unanimous email vote approve a contract with Concrete Jack in the amount of \$12,831 for community-wide sidewalk repairs.

Moved to ratify the earlier unanimous email vote to approve a contract with Ecotek Power Wash in the amount of \$9,120 to soft clean roofs in Courts 1-4.

Moved to ratify the earlier unanimous email vote to approve a contract with Rose Paving in the amount of \$13,511.42 to sealcoat, crack fill, and stripe the parking lots in Courts 3, 5, 10, 12, 13, and 16.

Moved to ratify the earlier unanimous email vote to approve Fairlington FINS to use the Glen pool in July.

NEXT MEETING

The next monthly Board meeting is scheduled on Tuesday, June 10, 2025, at 6:30pm. The meeting will be held virtually via Zoom. Details to access the meeting will be announced closer to the date.

Another Reason for Fully Funded Reserves



The Glen is responsible for repairing/replacing the sewer pipes running under basement slabs. This requires that the concrete slabs be jack-hammered up and repaired during the replacement. An added cost is repair of any structural damage to the condition that it was in after the renovation of the units in the 1970's. For example, the Glen would give an owner an allowance equal to the cost of (1) replacing the slab covering with the type of asphalt tiles that were installed after the 1970's conversion but not (2) the cost of porcelain tiles that were installed by a subsequent owner.

The lines under the slabs are aging cast iron pipes that will, sooner or later, have to be replaced. Until now, we have had to dig-out only the easier-to-replace laterals that connect with the County lines. These laterals connect perpendicularly with the two cast iron sewer pipes that run under the slab along the back side of a building. From this connection point, the lateral runs out from under the building and joins with a line that connects to the County line. The cost of replacing even these shorter lateral segments can be considerable. For example, we recently contracted to replace only 18 feet of one lateral running under a slab at a cost of \$10,039, which does not include an allowance for covering the repaired slab.


So far, we have not had to replace any of the longer cast iron pipes running under a slab along the back of each building. But it's a matter of "when," not "if." The cost of could be considerable. For cost economies, we may have to dig-up and replace the entire length of each line running under the back of the basement slab, a repair that would involve every unit in the building. The cost would be reduced if we could re-line these pipes rather than dig-out their entire length; but, relining does not always work and would be more difficult for these harder-to-reach pipes.

To prepare for this type of expense, we need to build-up our reserves, rather than resort to borrowing and special assessments at high interest rates during uncertain economic times. If we do not fully fund our reserves, the Glen's latter-day residents will find themselves to be in a situation where transient, earlier residents who did not contribute to the full cost of replacing old assets moved on, leaving the latter-day residents to get stuck with the entire replacement cost. This has, in fact, been happening in neighboring associations, which have had to resort to special assessments to replace aging assets.

Please Note Pet Owner Responsibilities

All pet owners must abide by Glen policy and Arlington County regulations concerning pets, including required vaccinations and licensing. Both a rabies vaccination tag and a County dog license tag must be secured on a dog's collar at all times.

A copy of Arlington County's regulations governing animal welfare may be obtained from the Department of Animal Control. All owners have sole legal and financial responsibility for the behavior of their pets.



Please keep dogs on a leash at all times.

When taken outdoors, dogs are to be kept on a leash at all times. Dogs are not permitted to run at large except at designated "off-leash" dog exercise areas located in Arlington County, the closest being Utah Field.

Pet owners must not allow their pets to make noise on a continuous or even frequent basis.

Pet owners (or their agents) must clean up after their dogs at all times. Dog waste should be deposited with regular household trash or in community trash cans located along the sidewalks in the Glen. Dog waste should never be dumped into a storm sewer because it then enters untreated into streams and rivers.

Fairlington Glen is a very dog-friendly neighborhood. But please follow these simple rules when it comes to your dog. Thank you!

Real Estate Taxes are Due June 15

The first installment of the 2025 Arlington County real estate taxes is due June 15, 2025. *Note, if the due date falls on a Saturday, Sunday (as it does this year), or holiday, late payment penalties will not be assessed for payments made on the following business day.*




Real estate bills have already been mailed. Remember, you will not receive a bill if your taxes are paid from an escrow account through your mortgage. If you have a mortgage and have received a bill, please contact your mortgage company immediately.

When real estate is sold, responsibility for payment of taxes is worked out during settlement. If you've sold the property referred to on the tax bill and another person has assumed responsibility for payment, return the bill to the Treasurer's Office, 2100 Clarendon Blvd, Suite 201, Arlington, VA 22201, with any information you have about the new owner. Contact your settlement attorney with any questions regarding who is responsible for paying taxes on the sold property.

Rescheduled Spring E-CARE is June 21

Arlington County has rescheduled its popular biannual Environmental Collection and Recycling Event (E-CARE) on Saturday, June 21 from 7:30am to 2:00pm at 1425 N. Quincy Street (not Wakefield High School as previously scheduled).



This event, which allows Arlington residents to quickly and safely dispose of household hazardous materials (HHM's) and old electronics, will be held rain or shine.

NEW FOR THIS EVENT - Bicycles will be accepted as donations by Bikes for the World. Bike donations will be taken before unloading HHMs, e-waste and small metal items. Please pack your vehicle accordingly.

Be sure to follow these important guidelines: Bring your ID to verify County residency. Materials will only be accepted during the event's post-ed hours. Business and commercial wastes will not be accepted. Smoking is not allowed at the drop-off site.

There is a fee only for the old-style cathode ray televisions (\$20) and cathode ray computer monitors (\$15). All other screen and monitor drop-offs are free. Cash must be exact change. Checks should be made payable to "Arlington County Treasurer."

Items that are unacceptable include: asbestos, explosives, ammunitions, freon, medical wastes, prescription medicines, and radioactive materials.

Primary Election is Tuesday, June 17



The Democratic Party has requested a primary election, which will be held on Tuesday, June 17, for the purpose of selecting candidates for the offices of Virginia Lieutenant Governor, Virginia Attorney General, and member Arlington County Board.

Only offices with more than one candidate are on the primary ballot. In offices where only one candidate qualified, that candidate automatically wins the party nomination and will be on the ballot in November. The Republican Primary for Lieutenant Governor was canceled on April 22, 2025 due to a candidate withdrawing from the race. The remaining unopposed candidate automatically became the Republican nominee who will appear on the ballot in November.

Virginia is an open primary state meaning that voters do not register by political party. Any registered voter is eligible to vote in any primary election. If both the Democratic and Republican parties hold primaries on the same day, voters must choose which party ballot they wish to vote, per Virginia Code § 24.2-530.

The Glen is in Precinct 112, and we vote in person at the Fairlington Community Center, 3308 S. Stafford Street. Polls will be open from 6:00am to 7:00pm.

Virginia law requires all voters to provide an acceptable form of identification at the polls. Voters arriving at the polls without an acceptable form of ID will be required to either sign an ID Confirmation Statement or vote a provisional ballot. Acceptable forms of identification for voting at the polling place include:

- Voter Card you received when you registered to vote
- Virginia DMV-issued Driver's License or Identification Card
- Valid United States Passport
- Any ID card issued by the U.S., Virginia, or a local Virginia government
- Any student ID card issued by a U.S. university or community
- Valid student ID issued by a public school or private school in Virginia
- Employer-issued photo ID card
- Any current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document with your name and address
- An ID Confirmation Statement
